The Church at Prayer: The Priest

21. The priest joins with the congregation in singing the acclamations, chants, hymns, and song of the Liturgy. However, the priest does not join in the singing of the Memorial Acclamation of the Great Amen. To the greatest extent possible, he should use a congregational worship aid during the processions and other rituals of the Liturgy and should be attentive to the cantor and psalmist as they lead the gathered assembly in song. In order to promote the corporate voice of the assembly when it sings, the priest's own voice should not be heard above the congregation, nor should he sing the congregational response of the dialogues. While the assembly sings, the priest should step back from the microphone, or, if he is using a wireless microphone, he should turn it off. - *Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, USCCB 2007.*
